UNIV Courses are offered by the Division of Academic Enhancement, a unit of the Office of Instruction at the University of Georgia.

The Division of Academic Enhancement empowers all students to *Learn Differently* through innovative courses, programs, services, and student-centered initiatives. The DAE supports students as they transition into higher education and sustains their progress through the University's unique academic environment.

Course Description

Provides transfer students opportunities in writing, reading, research, and communication strategies for success within the University's unique learning environments. To enhance the transfer experience, students will examine resources and the missions, purpose, and character of the University. Selected texts, guest speakers, and campus events will provide materials for seminar exchanges. Hallmark of the course will be attention to the importance of attendance, preparation, and engagement in University classrooms.

Learning Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be more:

- Knowledgeable about the resources on campus and better prepared to understand and complete writing assignments for other courses
- Engaged with campus resources including academic, social, and health services

- Connected with the UGA community in and outside the classroom
- Understanding of the college academic expectations
- Skilled in how to gain research experience
- Prepared for future opportunities at UGA and beyond

Course Assignments

Weekly Discussion Boards

Each week there will be a prompt related to that week's discussion topic in which students are to answer the prompt as well as engage with one another. Prompts will be posted on the eLC Discussion board, and deadlines for engagement will be posted.

Reflective Essays

Each week students will be assigned to write a short essay. The essay should be typed and must address the topic of the week. Students will be asked to write about what information they discover regarding the topic at hand. Every essay must include observations about the topic and relevant resources as well as how students themselves might make use of or engage with that week's topic during their time as a student at UGA. At the end of the semester, students will be asked for the final assignment to turn in an updated resume and a short essay about their goals at UGA and beyond.

Outside Events

Throughout the course of the semester you will need to attend **at least 3** UGA sponsored events outside of the class meeting period. **You can attend in-person events or virtual events.** These events can be found listed in the **UGA Calendar of Events** and the **Career Center Calendar of Events**. If you attend a UGA sporting event, you will only be able to receive credit towards one "outside event" for your calculated grade.

Following the event that you attend you will need to write **at least a one page summary** of the event and how it impacted your UGA experience. *Format:* Georgia, Arial or Times New Roman Font, Size: 10-12, 1" margins, Double-spaced paragraph spacing. This must be a UGA sanctioned or sponsored event, listed on the UGA Calendar of Events. **If you are unsure if the event you want to attend will be accepted, you must speak with your instructor <u>beforehand</u> to approval. For example: a party hosted by one of the Greek houses affiliated with the University does NOT count.**

Grading/Evaluation

Students will be evaluated based on eLC module participation/engagement, weekly reflective essay assignments, and attendance to 3 University events outside of the class meeting period. Full credit will be given if the essay meets the following requirements: 3 sentences at least with name and date included.

Engagement in class session modules - including Discussion Board postings (20%)

Weekly Reflective Essays (50%)

Outside Event Write ups (30% - 10% for each)
